BOAT REGISTRATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2020

A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND THE BOAT REGISTRATION ACT

Enacted by the Parliament of The Bahamas

1. Short title and commencement.

- (1) This Act, which amends the Boat Registration Act *(Ch. 277),* may be cited as the Boat Registration (Amendment) Act, 2020.
- (2) This Act shall come into force on the 1^{st} day of July, 2020.

2. Insertion of new section 3A into Ch. 277.

The Boat Registration Act is amended by the insertion immediately after section 3 of the following new section —

" "3A. Electronic submission of applications.

- (1) The Minister may enter into an agreement with a vendor to administer the electronic
 - (a) submission and processing of applications; and
 - (b) issuance of permits and licences,

under the Boat Registration (Yacht), Rules.¹

- (2) An application submitted in accordance with subsection (1) shall be deemed to be an application made to the Authority.
- (3) A vendor authorized under subsection (1) shall
 - (a) grant the Authority electronic access to every application made in accordance with subsection (1) to facilitate the Authority's approval of the application;
 - (b) only issue a permit or licence where the Authority has approved the application;

- (c) be entitled to charge, collect and retain a processing fee, as agreed in consultation with the Minister, in respect of every application made and permit or licence issued under the Boat Registration (Yacht) Rules²; and
- (d) charge, collect and transfer to the Authority, in respect of every application made and permit or licence issued under the Boat Registration (Yacht), Rules, the fee payable in accordance with the *Second Schedule* of those Rules.".

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act to insert a new section 3A which empowers the Minister to approve a vendor to administer the submission and processing of applications made under the Boat Registration (Yacht), Rules and the subsequent electronic issuance of a permit or licence.

The proposed new section 3A also seeks to provide for the charging of a processing fee by the vendor and the forwarding of the application fees, paid by an applicant, to the Authority.
